MOTION by Councilman Paolucci, seconded by Councilwoman Walowit, to remove Resolution No. 66 of 2004 from the table for consideration.

Resolution No. 66 of 2004, a resolution authorizing the Supervisor to enter into a contract for the purchase of land for a multi-use path.

Introduced by Councilman Paolucci, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Walowit.

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to complete the multi-use path along Miller Road, and

WHEREAS, in order to complete the pathway, the Town Board wishes to enter into a contract with Jeffrey A. Goldman and Sharon A. Goldman to purchase a parcel of land on Miller Road from them, at a cost of \$9,000.00, and

WHEREAS, entering into this agreement will confer a benefit upon the residents of the Town of Clifton Park; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is authorized to enter into a contract with Jeffrey A. Goldman and Sharon A. Goldman, for property on Miller Road, at a cost of \$9,000.00, to be paid from A-7629-15 (Trails).

Councilman Paolucci stated the funds for this purchase should come from the trails budget line not open space. The Town Board agreed with this change. Councilman Paolucci said this has come about due to a safety issue.

Planning Director Kemper displayed a map, stating it is necessary to extend the trail for pedestrian safety. He reviewed locations of various subdivisions and the history of the trail in that area. Mr. Kemper reported the property owners are willing to allow a trail on their property as long as a privacy fence and plantings are put up. He received an estimate from the property owners of just under \$8000 for the fence and approximately \$2000 for the plantings. After his discussion with Clough, Harbor & Associates, it was recommended the town purchase the property rather than having to maintain a fence and plantings. The property owners have agreed to this.

Councilman Paolucci noted that the place of minimal sight distance is where the trail ends at this time.

Eric Hamilton, Chair of the Trails Committee, reported due to a change in grade after the crest of the hill, there is a definite safety hazard without the extension of the trail.

Mr. Kemper noted this land purchase amounts to 2151 square feet. He further stated there is a mortgage and home equity on the property and Ass't Town Attorney Peller is reviewing the issue.

Councilman Roth said he wants to make sure monies are being spent in the most economic way and asked Mr. Trainor if there is anything in the law that says the town is required to reduce speed limit to 20 miles per hour if there is a pedestrian crossing. Mr. Trainor said that would need to be researched. Councilman Paolucci noted the town does not have the authority to reduce speed limits below 30 mph.

Mr. Kemper reiterated the town's option of either buying the land or putting up a fence and plantings. He recommended buying the land so as not to have the upkeep of the fence and plantings. He estimated the \$9000 for the purchase of the land is \$1000 less then the purchase of the fence and plantings.

WHEREAS, quotes were received by the Town Board, as Commissioners of the Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek Park District, for landscaping services for Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek Park District, and

WHEREAS, the lowest conforming quote for the work to be done was \$4,365.00 for the season, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to award the contract to the most qualified landscaper for the work to be performed, Staucet's Landscaping in the amount of \$4,870.00; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board, acting as Commissioners of the Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek Park District, hereby awards the contract to Staucet's Landscaping for landscaping services for Clifton Knolls/Mill Creek Park District from Spring to Fall 2004, at a cost not to exceed \$4,870.00 to be budgeted from SP3-7131-15(Other Contractual).

WHEREAS, the Assessor has recommended that the Town Board consider amending Chapter 125, Sections 6, 8, 9 and 12 of the Town Code regarding Conservation Easements, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to solicit the comments of the Town's citizens regarding the proposed changes; now, therefore, be it

He said, per Transfer Station Supervisor Vedder, this arrangement is working out very well.
