**ANNOUNCEMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS**

Councilman Roth acknowledged receipt of a letter of resignation from James Quinn, Chairman of the Environmental Commission effective April 30, 2009. He expressed appreciation to Mr. Quinn for his service to the Town of Clifton Park.

Councilman Roth reviewed Environmental Specialist Montague's report of May 4, 2009 regarding the composting operation, attached.

Councilman Hughes reviewed the successful Arbor Day on the Common and the tree give away.

Councilman Hughes reported full day summer camp registrations are being taken at a charge of \$85.00 per week. He said the camp runs from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. but "extra care hours" are offered for working parents at an additional fee. He reviewed planned activities. Councilman Hughes said camp staff is trained in the use of epi-pens.

Supervisor Barrett reported there was a great response to the Bio Blitz held at the McElroy Road park. Director of Planning Scavo speaking with regard to the Bio Blitz reported about 130 participants and 231 species identified in approximately 11 hours. He said the site included a variety of different habitats. He reported two volunteers from the National Honor Society registered participants, five Shenendehowa science teachers led guided tours, and representative from DEC exhibited turtles and frogs, various Boy and Girl Scout troops attended throughout the day. Mr. Scavo stated it was a very successful day and expressed appreciation to the town Open Space Coordinator Viggiani for planning this event and to the Town Board for their support.

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Supervisor Barrett asked Ms. McHugh to schedule another shredding day.

Speaking with regard to the HESS contract for gas savings, Supervisor Barrett said he is inclined to go with the conservative route. The Town Board agreed. Mr. Heggen reported the contract will go to the end of 2010.

Supervisor Barrett announced the winners of the Arbor Day poster contest.

Supervisor Barrett reviewed the list submitted by Mr. O'Brien of areas that don't have public sewers: Katherine Terrace, Dyer Drive, East Side Drive, north of Route 146, Blue Barns/Country Club Acre area and Appleton Road/Nott Road. If there are any other areas to consider, contact Supervisor Barrett and Supervisor of Facilities O'Brien. Councilman Roth recommended considering Route 146A and also to speak with the Town of Ballston.

Supervisor Barrett, speaking with regard to the composting facility, said he contacted DEC to meet with them and the contractors to make sure the facility is running as efficiently as possible and to work with DEC on a regional basis to discuss the yard waste issue for the next 3 to 5 years.

Councilman Hughes reminded residents ice storm debris will be picked up until May 15, 2009.

#### REPORTS TO THE BOARD

Superintendent of Schools Oliver Robinson reviewed the school budget, noting a less than two percent tax increase. He announced the dedication of the new pool will be held June 6, 2009.

Joe McCrudden, Clifton Park Baseball, reported the league is looking to host the Mid Atlantic Regional games. He submitted a request for \$18,000 for upgrades to the facilities.

Councilwoman Walowit noted dogs are required to be on leash except for Kinns Road Park and the Mary Jane Row Dog Park. She said town law requires owners to clean up after their dogs.

Peter Gonczlik, Baltusrol Drive, Friends of Kinns Road Park, said the new signage at Kinns Road Park has given more awareness. It was noted more people are applying for permits and this has required people to apply for dog licenses.

#### PUBLIC PRIVILEGE ON RESOLUTIONS

Question from floor regarding the proposed water connection to 117 Eastline Road and concern that it will cut into 119 Eastline Road property. Mr. McCarthy reported this comes from a resolution passed by the Clifton Park Water Authority granting the access and the state legislation that created the Water Authority requires the Town Board approve any connection outside of the Water Authority service area. He said he was not sure of the proposed route.

William Engleman, Partridge Plateau, had questions regarding the cost of the grass carp for the Clifton Knolls ponds as well as the ponds acreage. Mr. Montague reviewed the approximate acreage of the three ponds. Mr. Engleman asked how many carp does the permit allow. Mr. Montague responded 125 for Barney Road pond, 75 for the Beechwood pond and 50 for Par Del Rio and this was last done in 2005. Mr. Engleman stated the permit allows the addition of 50 grass carp and questioned the additional 200 carp. Mr. Montague responded he has spoken with DEC and they are sending a permit for the remaining fish. Councilman Hughes noted the request for the grass carp came from the Clifton Knolls Park District Committee. Mr. Engleman disagreed with the amount of fish being used. Supervisor Barrett asked Mr. Montague to check with DEC on the numbers. Mr. Montague said Ms. Judy Hughes of the Park District does note the quality of vegetation in the ponds. Mr. Engleman asked what efforts have been made in the past several years regarding reducing nutrient loading into the ponds. Supervisor Barrett recommended Mr. Montague speak with Ms. Hughes regarding fertilizer use of the golf course and homeowners.

WHEREAS, DOH protocols require that a licensed physician oversee the Town's plan and program for the administration of epinephrine in emergencies involving potential allergies at day camps, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Buckley is a physician and pediatrician licensed in the State of New York and as Health Officer for the Town has agreed to oversee and supervise the Town's Epi Pen program; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign a Memorandum of Agreement with Town Health Officer Dr. Gayle Buckley to supervise the Epinephrine Auto-Injector Administration Plan for the Summer Day Camps; and be it further

Resolution No. 147 of 2009, a resolution authorizing the Town Supervisor to sign an Inter-Municipal Agreement with the Town of Halfmoon to plan, design, engineer and construct an asphalt paved multi use path with sidewalks along Crescent Road, generally beginning at the intersection with Dunsbach Road in the Town of Halfmoon, and continuing across the Clifton Park Town line through the Lapp Road Corridor with its terminus at Okte Elementary School.

Introduced by Councilman Hughes, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilman Paolucci.

WHEREAS, in November of 2004 the Town of Clifton Park proposed a Congestion-Mitigation-Air Quality (CMAQ) project targeting improvements along the Crescent Road corridor, jointly with the Town of Halfmoon in response to the Capital District Transportation Committee's (CDTC) annual Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) solicitation for projects, and

WHEREAS, in 2004 the project was estimated at \$790,000 with both Towns agreeing to pay a 20% cash match of the project's cost, and

WHEREAS, the proposed project was added to the TIP by vote of the CDTC and 80% Federal allowance (\$632,000) for the pathway was established with an estimated Town cash share at that time of \$79,000 for each Town, for a total cash match of \$158,000, and

WHEREAS, the project was not funded at that time but scheduled for funding in the 2007-2008 fiscal year, and

WHEREAS, in 2006 the Town of Clifton Park proposed to add crosswalks and other pedestrian improvements to the pathway project at two locations, the Okte School entrance and the intersection of Crescent, Lapp and Southbury Roads as part of the "Spot Improvement" program and the Town of Clifton Park was awarded additional federal funding in the amount of \$24,000 and \$25,000 respectively for a \$61,000 project, and

WHEREAS, Clifton Park's local cash match for these pedestrian improvements is estimated to be \$12,000, and

WHEREAS, the "Spot Improvement" was to be rolled into the CMAQ pathway project as a single project and at that time raising the Town of Clifton Park's cash match to \$143,500, and

WHEREAS, during late 2007, by CDTC resolution the projects were re-scheduled, grouped together and scheduled for the federal 2008-2009 fiscal year, and

WHEREAS, during 2008 the Department of Transportation (DOT) and CDTC conducted TIP review and in 2009 DOT has estimated the entire pathway project costs (The Joint Project) at \$894,000 with the Federal share being capped at \$632,000, and

WHEREAS, the Joint Project costs have been estimated at \$894,000, with grant funds totaling \$632,000, and the Okte/Lapp Road Pedestrian Improvements localized to the Town of Clifton Park are \$61,000 with \$49,000 in Grant Funds, and

WHEREAS, the Grant Program requires that the recipients provide a match from local and/or State funds totaling an estimated \$131,000 for the Joint Program and \$12,000 for the Pedestrian Improvements in the Okte/Lapp Road area, and

WHEREAS, the Town Boards of the Towns of Clifton Park and Halfmoon wish to enter into a cooperative agreement pursuant to the Authority of General Municipal Law §119 regarding their respective rights, duties and responsibilities of the project, and to determine their respective contributions toward the "sponsor match" relative to the Joint Project involving both Towns; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign the attached Inter-Municipal Agreement with the Town of Halfmoon to plan, design, engineer and construct an

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asphalt paved multi use path with sidewalks along Crescent Road, generally beginning at the intersection with Dunsbach Road in the Town of Halfmoon, and continuing across the Clifton Park Town line, through the Lapp Road Corridor, with its terminus at Okte Elementary School; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes the expenditure of \$143,500 in local funds for the Joint Crescent Road Project with the Town of Halfmoon as well as the improvements to the Okte/Lapp Road Corridor.

Councilman Roth spoke favorably of this appointment and noted Mr. Ferraro has been a member of the ECC for a number of years. He presently serves as the Executive Director of the Capital District Planning Commission. Supervisor Barrett said he is one of the Commissioners from Saratoga County on the Commission and as such sets policy for CDPC.

PUBLIC PRIVILEGE

Allan North, Carlton Road, asked, for the safety of residents, the town complete the Kinns Road Trail. He expressed concern with the operating costs of the school district, noting citizens are severely impacted.

Bill Koebbeman, Riverview Road, read a prepared statement, attached. He expressed concern with leaving open space with existing zoning and stated there should be a zoning category for open space.

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Mr. McCarthy explained the Dwaaskill Nature Preserve and all the other parks the town has purchased are protected by parkland alienation. He said state protections that exist trump what a zoning statute could do. He said he has discussed with Mr. Koebbeman how a zoning statute could conflict with the town's Section 153 – Nature Preserves.
