WHEREAS, the adjusted average daily total of traffic entering the intersection eastbound on Grooms Road is 4,284 vehicles, and

WHEREAS, the 2009 Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) 2009 Edition, notes that a "No Turn on Red" sign should be considered when the following conditions exists: An unacceptable number of pedestrian conflicts with right-turn-on red maneuvers, especially involving children, older pedestrians, or persons with disabilities, and inadequate sight distance to vehicles approaching from the left (or right if applicable), and

WHEREAS, the presence of the Clifton Park Nursery School creates conflicts for vehicles turning right on red from traveling eastbound on Grooms Road to then turning right and proceeding southbound on Moe Road, and

WHEREAS, The Clifton Park Nursery School building does block sight distance for vehicles traveling east on CR-91 (Grooms Road) and turning right (south) onto Moe Road, and

WHEREAS, many children with parents cross Moe Road south of the intersection as pedestrians to get to and from their vehicles to the nursery school buildings; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Highway Superintendent and/or Saratoga County Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to install a R10-11, "No Turn On Red" traffic signal sign for vehicles approaching the Eastbound leg of the intersection on Grooms Road, and be it further

WHEREAS, in October, the Department of Environmental Conservation implemented statewide regulations imposing a new law on open burning which applies in Clifton Park and conflicts with the Town of Clifton Park Open Burning Law, and

WHEREAS, the new law preserves the backyard fireplaces/fire pits that are popular in many areas of the Town, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to obtain comment regarding the proposed changes to Chapter 80, of the Town Code; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a public hearing is scheduled for April 12, 2010 at 7:10 P.M. in the Wood Memorial Room, One Town Hall Plaza, Clifton Park, NY to consider changes to Chapter 80, of the Town Code, entitled Burning; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is directed to publish appropriate notice of the same.

Chief of the Bureau of Fire Prevention Reed explained the proposed legislation is implementing the new NYS Department of Environmental Conservation code and replacing the current code. This will give better guidelines for enforcement and for the community. She stated this will not change anything for the agricultural farmers, noting they will still be able to obtain town permits to burn.

Town Attorney McCarthy said enforcement is not specified in the proposed legislation. Mrs. Reed said Section 80.3 refers to enforcement by Code Enforcement Officers, which would be any inspector in the Building Department or a fire department official of the local jurisdiction. Discussion ensued regarding adding Security Officers to the legislation. Mrs. Reed noted Code Enforcement is on call 24/7 so if Security was called first, they would notify Code Enforcement.

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$154,000.00 (One hundred fifty four thousand dollars and no cents) is hereby appropriated from Un-appropriated Fund Balance consistent with the May 5, 2009 Intermunicipal Agreement between the Towns of Clifton Park and Halfmoon and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project, and it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Town Board of the Town of Clifton Park shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the New York State Department of Transportation thereof, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor of the Town of Clifton Park be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or Marchiselli Aid on behalf of the Town of Clifton Park with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and it is further

PUBLIC PRIVILEGE

Norman Goldman, London Square Drive, asked a variety of questions: (1) how many buildable acres there are in the LIA overlay zone. (2) does the Highway Department have sufficient funds to care for the roads after the last few winters. (3) the language in Adult Entertainment legislation Section 50.2. Mr. Goldman stated he feels the Kiwanis carnival should be subject to the Transient Merchant law.

Beverly Czub, Miller Road, asked if there is anything new regarding the purchase of the Stony Creek Reservoir. Supervisor Barrett responded no and, unfortunately at this point, doesn't see any reason to be optimistic.

Trevor Gensch, Sandpiper Lane, asked for an update on the drainage issue. Supervisor Barrett responded the Army Corp of Engineers (ACOE) has been out with the town engineer. Mr. Shahan responded a letter was received from J.M. McDonald Engineering. Mr. Gensch reported he was invited to a meeting on the March 19 at 10:00 a.m. at which no one showed up, however, he understands there was a meeting at 9:00 a.m. and expressed concern he was not included in that meeting. Mr. Shahan said there was a meeting on the 19th at which the ACOE attended but said they couldn't walk the property at that time. Mr. Gensch reported he has met with the town engineer and ACOE. Mr. Gensch stated it has been 10 months since the initial complaint and a month since the last meeting with the town and finds this unacceptable. He said his farmland is being flooded, water table is rising and this is unacceptable and wants the town to do something about it.

MOTION by Councilwoman Walowit, seconded by Councilman Paolucci, to adjourn the meeting to the next regular meeting or any other meeting necessary for the conduct of Town business.
