**ANNOUNCEMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS**

Supervisor Barrett announced the upcoming Not So Common Players production "The Fantasticks" to be presented April 30, May 1-9.

The Supervisor thanked all involved in the very successful Shredding Day.

Councilman Hughes announced the Historic House Tour is scheduled for May 16<sup>th</sup>. All proceeds will be used for maintenance and upkeep of Grooms Tavern.

**EARTH DAY 2010 PRESENTATION**

In honor of Earth Day, Councilman Hughes gave a presentation, attached, of the town's accomplishments in this regard. He reviewed history of the town's Open Space Plan, noting since 2000 approximately 1000 acres have been protected. He reported Clifton Park was the first town in New York State to hire an Environmental Specialist. He further noted the town has created enhanced public access to the waterfront and Nature Preserves through grants, as well as town monies. Councilman Hughes reviewed the following Key Town Priorities: Preserve Open Space, Connect the Trails Network, Protect Farmland, Enhance Parks and Recreation, Conserve Energy and Natural Resources. He thanked David Miller and Jim Romano, former co-chairs of the Open Space, Trails and Riverfront Committee for all their work and dedication. He reviewed activities of the town G.R.E.E.N. Committee to conserve energy and natural resources.

Councilman Romano said the Open Space Committee is looking at the approximately 300 town-owned parcels and is researching stewardship programs which will be very important in maintaining these properties in the future. He asked anyone interested in getting a group of people together to assist in this regard to contact Open Space Coordinator Jennifer Viggiani.

REPORTS TO THE BOARD

Town Comptroller Heggen presented the March Financial Report, noting expenditures and revenue are in line.

Town Administrator Shahan said he, Messrs. Myers, Kazmierczak, Kukuk and Handerhan have resolved most of the sink hole problems reported by residents. He has looked at The Grange, noting it is going to require a great deal of work and has asked Buildings and Grounds to try and get it into a useable condition. Mr. Shahan further reported some of the Common roads need paving, as well as part of the parking lot at Burning Bush Clubhouse. Supervisor Barrett recommended paving the entrance to the Common. Mr. Shahan said the Parkside Trail parking lot will be cleaned up. He reported a letter has been sent to the soccer club with the parking restrictions on Parkside Trail.

WHEREAS, the Town of Clifton Park Town Board wishes to acknowledge and honor Sean's achievements, including his Eagle Scout Service Project which entailed leading a group of adult and youth volunteers in erecting seven flag poles including landscaping and lighting for the flagpoles located at the baseball fields at Clifton Common, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board agrees that consistency and safety would be served by extending the 40 mph speed zone to Miller Road, and

WHEREAS, on March 29, 2010, the bids were received for the above referenced contract which involves trail construction and a new parking area on Town-owned park land in Stony Creek I Park District, and

WHEREAS, Paul Olund, R.L.A., of Environmental Design Partnership, LLC, consultant to the Town, has reviewed the bids and has recommended that the bid be awarded to Cleveland Brothers Landscaping, Inc., Corinth, NY, as low bidder, in an amount of \$148,536.00; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board as Commissioners of the Stony Creek Park District No 1 hereby accepts and awards the above referenced bid to Cleveland Brothers Landscaping,

Supervisor Barrett referred to a letter from Cleveland Brothers Landscaping, the low bidder, clarifying their bid. He explained though there were errors in their bid it did not change the actual bid amount or any of the specs.

Mr. Scavo said the park district was able to accommodate the concerns of residents to minimize impacts of the trail.

Resolution No. 95 of 2010, a resolution authorizing the Supervisor to sign a Memorandum of Understanding to accept a \$37,500 Grant Award from the Capital District Transportation Committee's Community and Transportation Linkage Program and provide the required \$27,500 cash match.

Introduced by Councilman Hughes, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilman Paolucci.

WHEREAS, the Town of Clifton Park has been awarded \$37,500 from the Capital District Transportation Committee (CDTC), the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Capital District, through the Community and Transportation Linkage Program, and

WHEREAS, the goal of the state program is to assist communities in implementing their Linkage Projects, for which the Town completed the Exit 9 Land Use and Transportation Study jointly with Halfmoon in 2008, and

WHEREAS, the new grant project is to develop a Town Center land use plan in Clifton Park to advance the Exit 9 Study's recommendations on land use and transportation enhancements that serve to strengthen Clifton Park's quality of life, mobility and the vitality of its economic base focused at and near Exit 9, and

WHEREAS, the CDTC has approved the Clifton Park Town Center Plan in its 2010-2012 Unified Work Planning Program, and

WHEREAS, the CDTC has approved a grant study consultant cost of \$65,000 (\$37,500 federal and \$27,500 local cash match), and

WHEREAS, the Town and the CDTC will work together to secure a consultant and invoice the Town of Clifton Park for the cash match at the time that 25% of the study has been completed, as local cash will be used to pay the consultant first and federal funds will be used last; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is authorized to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (as attached) with the CDTC, and work with town staff and CDTC staff to advance this project in a timely manner, and be it further

RESOLVED, that budget line item A-6989-135 (General Fund-Other Economic Development-Engineering) in the amount of \$27,500 is established to create the local cash match for this project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a transfer from Undesignated Fund Balance (A909) of \$27,500 is hereby authorized to A-6989-135 (General Fund-Other Economic Development-Engineering).

Mr. Scavo explained this is focusing on Exit 9 heading west to the Moe Road- Route 146 intersection looking at the functionality, anticipation of involving the existing zoning and at existing zoning regulations to encourage sustainable growth. He noted in the tough economic times just weathered, that corridor saw a significant reinvestment. He said this is the economic engine of the community moving forward and demonstrating the private investment in the corridor furthers the argument with DOT that we need an investment into the infrastructure that is part of the state highway system.

Supervisor Barrett noted million and millions of dollars in private sector investment has been made in that small area and improvements regarding traffic, pavement, markings, pedestrian access can't be done without NYS Department of Transportation.

Mr. Scavo said every five years the Capital District Transportation Commission, who are the partners with this grant, develop a Transportation Improvement Program project list which receives federal funding that is guaranteed to New York State. He explained this study will advance where we fall in the TIP project list and will also provide the ability to get stakeholder participation and come up with better design details. Mr. Scavo noted because of funding availability in the Concept Plan for the Exit 9 Corridor Study, it wasn't possible to go into great detail but under this scope a simulation can be created of what the corridor is anticipated to look like and will drive the corridor improvements.

Councilman Hughes said the area can also be improved aesthetically and it is all premised upon partnership with DOT and others who can help to advance this as a priority.

Supervisor Barrett said the Buildings and Grounds Department have done a great job on Clifton Country Road with plantings and flowers.

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 212 of 2009 awarded the bid to National Water Main Cleaning Co., and

WHEREAS, NWMC successfully completed work for the 2009 Season, and the contract provides for extension of the existing contract for one year based on 2009 unit pricing, and

WHEREAS, NWMC has agreed to perform additional work in accordance with the contract requirements for no increase in their unit bid prices of \$1.00 per foot, not to exceed \$61,000, and

WHEREAS, as per letter from McDonald Engineering, dated April 2, 2010, McDonald Engineering has recommended to the Town Supervisor that the contract be extended for one year in the amount of \$61,000 based on NWMC'S 2009 unit prices; now, therefore, be it

estimated total cost of contract is \$61,000, \$50,000 to be paid from G7-8111-35 (Sewer District No.1-Sewer Line Cleaning) and \$11,000 to be transferred from G7-8111-21 (Sewer District No. 1-Emergency Repairs) to G7-8111-35 (Sewer District No. 1-Sewer Line Cleaning).



Collection System Manager O'Brien explained this is a continuation of cooperation with NYSDEC in getting all sewer lines thoroughly inspected. He said this is the last year to build into a program of rehabbing the bad areas. The Clifton Knolls subdivision is scheduled to be done and residents will be notified through signage and the website. This is the last year of the cleaning regiment for DEC and the town is required to get all pipes inventoried, mapped and inspected by video and the plan of action submitted to DEC. Mr. O'Brien said there has been a huge decrease in sewer issues because of the cleanings.
