ANNOUNCEMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Supervisor Barrett reported the tree clearing has begun at Kinns Road Park and is going very well. He noted the partnership with BOCES and the Town and thanked Dennis Flynn, head of the BOCES Forestry Program, Forestry Consultant Dick Cipperly and the students for their work. The stumps will be taken out once clearing is completed.

He announced County Waste was the only respondent to the Bulk Pick-up Bid with a bid of \$105,000. It is anticipated the free pick up will start on April 18 and continue to May 14.

Supervisor Barrett reminded residents to check what would be put out for bulk pick up as it may be something of use for the ReStore program that is part of Habitat for Humanity. There is a list of acceptable items on the town website and a drop off site at the Transfer Station. He noted the town's partnership with Habitat for Humanity is a first of its kind in the country.

The Supervisor announced a River, Trails and Parks Cleanup is scheduled for April 16th. He noted over 200 people volunteered in 2015. Volunteers can pick an area they would like to clean and then register with the town hall. Bags will be supplied.

WINTERFEST WINNERS

Supervisor Barrett introduced and congratulated Katie Lee winner of Clifton Park Idol in the 6-12 age group. Winner of the 13-18 age group, Molly McGrath, was not able to attend this evening.

Michael Kramer of Rocco's in Jonesville accepted the Soup Contest award for the smoked brisket chili. Rocco's also won the Soup Contest in 2015 for their corn chowder.

PUBLIC HEARING, 7:05 PM (7:18 pm)
TO CONSIDER A LOCAL LAW AMENDING
SECTIONS 103-15.2, 208-109C(3)(d), 208-109D(4)

The Town Clerk read the Notice of Public Hearing as published in The Daily Gazette on February 19, 2016.

Supervisor Barrett explained since some suggestions received at the first public hearing are being incorporated into the proposed legislation, it is necessary to hold a second public hearing.

Town Attorney McCarthy reviewed the changes made from the first public hearing, explaining area variances for residential properties should also carry a notice requirement and found this is common in surrounding communities. The requirement is for adjacent and abutting properties rather than 500 feet. Mr. McCarthy explained additionally any administrative determination made by the Code Enforcement Officer is subject to appeal by the Zoning Board.

The public hearing was opened for comments from the audience at 7:20 p.m.

Supervisor Barrett feels the changes are very good and the Town Board will consider passage of this legislation at an upcoming Town Board meeting.

Everyone was given an opportunity to speak in favor of or against the proposed local law and no one wished to be heard. Supervisor Barrett declared the public hearing closed at 7:21 pm.

PUBLIC PRIVILEGE ON RESOLUTIONS

Matt Andrus, Program Coordinator of Cancer Services Program of Saratoga County, explained this program provides breast, cervical and colorectal cancer screenings at no cost for men and women ages 40 to 64 without health insurance or the inability to pay.

Resolution No. 56 of 2016, a resolution authorizing the Supervisor to proclaim March 2016 as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month.

Introduced by Supervisor Barrett, who moved its adoption, seconded by the entire Town Board.

WHEREAS, *The Town of Clifton Park* joins to support observances that raise awareness of health issues that affect people across our state, nation, and the world, such as the various types of cancer, including colorectal cancer, and

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is a leading cause of cancer-related deaths among men and women in the United States; each year in New York State, nearly 10,000 people develop colorectal cancer and close to 3,500 New Yorkers die from this disease; it is estimated that one in twenty people will develop colorectal cancer during their lifetime, and

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer occurs most often in older people; approximately 60% of people newly-diagnosed with colon cancer are age 65 and older, and 90% of all colorectal cancers are diagnosed after age 50, and

WHEREAS, about 75% of colorectal cancer occurs in people who have no known risk factors; while the causes of colorectal cancer are not well understood, scientists agree that the following factors increase a person's risk of developing this disease: age, family history and hereditary conditions, personal health history, obesity, physical inactivity, diet, and other lifestyle factors such as cigarette smoking and excessive alcohol use, and

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer often can be prevented through regular screenings that can detect small growths, called polyps, which can be removed before they develop into cancer; screening for colorectal cancer is a covered benefit through Medicaid as well as health plans

participating in the New York State of Health, and the New York State Cancer Services Program offers colorectal cancer screening to eligible uninsured individuals in every county and New York City borough, and

WHEREAS, in support of the statewide and national goals to screen at least 80% of age and risk-appropriate men and women for colorectal cancer, New Yorkers and people everywhere are called upon to raise their awareness of colorectal cancer and take preventive steps to safeguard their health and that of loved ones from this disease;

Now, therefore, I, *Phillip Barrett, Town Supervisor*, do hereby proclaim March 2016 as COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS MONTH in the Town of Clifton Park.

WHEREAS, Saratoga County Local Law No. 2 of 1968 provided that Clifton Park would be represented by two Supervisors on the County Board including an At-Large Supervisor who is not a member of the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, by Local Law No. 2 of 2016, the County of Saratoga provided that in the event of a vacancy in the office of the second supervisor, who is not a member of the Town Board, the vacancy shall be filled in accordance with applicable provisions of the Town Code, and

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2016, the Town Board held a public hearing, duly noticed, to receive comments from the public on a proposal to provide for the filling of such vacancies by majority vote of the members of the Town Board, and

WHEREAS, all members of the public who wished to be heard provided such comment; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adopts Local Law No. 1 of 2016, a local law amending Chapter 33 of the Town Code, attached, and be it further

RESOLVED, that Local Law No. 1 of 1992, establishing and defining the office of the Town Administrator, is repealed; and be it further

Resolution No. 59 of 2016, a resolution authorizing the Supervisor to sign an incentive payment agreement pursuant to the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets' Round 13 Farmland Protection Implementation Grant Program.

Introduced by Councilman Romano, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Standaert.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 191 of 2014, the Town Board of the Town of Clifton Park authorized the Supervisor to apply to the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets for grant funds under its Farmland Incentive Protection Program, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Clifton Park was awarded such grants on or about February 15, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Farmland Protection Program provides grants to working farms, funded 75% by the State Department of Agriculture and Markets, with a 25% local match to be distributed over 5 years, and

WHEREAS, the incentive payment agreement requires that working farms receiving grant funds continue to operate throughout the terms of the agreement, as follows:
