WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie currently serves as the Chief of Staff for the New York Army National Guard and was promoted to the rank of Brigadier General on November 9, 2018, and

WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie is a graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point who was commissioned as an Armor Officer in 1989, serving among other assignments at Fort Knox, Kentucky and as a squadron commander with the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment at Fort Irwin, California, and

WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie relocated to the Capital Region in 1998 as an Assistant Professor of Military Science with the Mohawk Battalion at Siena College, and

WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie transitioned from active duty to reserve duty and joined the New York Army National Guard in October 2000, where he has served in numerous command and staff positions, most notably as the Chief of Plans, Deputy G3 and G3 for the 42nd Infantry Division, Deputy J3 and J3 for the New York National Guard, and Commander of the famed 1st Battalion, 69th Infantry Regiment - the famous "Fighting 69th," and

WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie deployed to Iraq in 2004 with the 42nd Infantry Division in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, serving as the Deputy G3 in charge of the division's Tactical Command Post in Tikrit, Iraq, and

WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie holds a Master of Business Administration degree from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, is a graduate of the Army War College, and is the recipient of numerous awards including the Bronze Star, the Meritorious Service Medal, Iraqi Campaign Medal and the Parachutist Badge, and

WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie has served as a leader and mentor for a generation of soldiers, and

WHEREAS, Brigadier General Andonie, his wife Kathy, and their daughters Rachel and Elizabeth have been proud to call Clifton Park home for 21 years; now, therefore, be it

Resolution No. 78 of 2019, a resolution awarding the bid for the Clifton Park Town Hall exterior renovation project pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 103.

Introduced by Councilwoman Standaert, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilman Whalen.

WHEREAS, the Department of Buildings and Grounds advertised bids for the renovation of the exterior of the Town Hall building, with bid opening on March 5, 2019, and

WHEREAS, Bishop Beaudry Construction, Schenectady, New York, submitted a bid in the amount of \$92,500 in response to the bid documents, and

WHEREAS, Bishop Beaudry recently concluded a contract for upgrades to the exterior doors at the Clifton Park Adult Community Center, and

WHEREAS, Daniel Clemens, Buildings & Grounds Supervisor, recommends that the contract be awarded to Bishop Beaudry as low bidder, and

WHEREAS, Bishop Beaudry has demonstrated qualifications and ability to satisfactorily perform work for the town; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the bid for the exterior renovations for the Town Hall building be awarded to Bishop Beaudry Construction, 2885 Curry Road, Schenectady, based on their bid, and the Supervisor is authorized to sign the attached contract in an amount not to exceed \$92,500; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the comptroller is authorized to transfer \$92,500 from A-914 (Unassigned Fund Balance) to A-1620-200 (Town Hall-Equipment) to offset costs of the work.

Daniel Clemens, Buildings & Grounds Supervisor, explained the original Town Hall building was built in 1957 with an addition to the front of the building in 1974 and the northeast corner of the building in 1995. Over time due to weather and age the building façade needs a complete replacement. The work would probably start April/May and take a month to complete.

WHEREAS, a request has been made by Jeffrey Vedder, Transfer Station Supervisor, for authorization to extend the hours of the Convenience Transfer Station for the annual Spring Clean Up/Green Up Week to include Sundays, April 28 and May 5, 2019, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Vedder has also requested that the Transfer Station be open on Sundays, October 27 and November 3, 10, and 17 between the hours of 10 am and 4 pm, for fall cleanup of leaves and brush only, and

WHEREAS, authorization for overtime costs for the extended hours is required; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the Clifton Park Justice Court was awarded \$4,620 from the Justice Court Assistance Program Grant; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the town initiated a Term Conservation Easement Program in 1996, with term easements issued with a minimum 15-year term thereafter, and

WHEREAS, the first term conservation easements issued pursuant to Town Code Chapter 125 expired in 2011, and

WHEREAS, on February 6, 2012, the Town Board adopted Local Law No. 1 of 2012 providing for the streamlining of the process for holders of existing term conservation easements to re-apply for terms of their choice, and

WHEREAS, an application was received from a holder of an existing conservation easement to renew their existing conservation easement, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 125-10 (C) the Town Board is required to hold a single public hearing on all applications for renewal annually, and act upon all applications for renewal of existing term conservation easements by April 10th; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Town Board hereby schedules a public hearing on April 8, 2019 at 7:00 P.M. in the Wood Memorial Room, One Town Hall Plaza, Clifton Park, New York to consider all applications submitted for renewing existing expiring conservation easements, pursuant to Chapter 125-10 (C) of the Town Code; and be it further

RESOLVED, the Town Clerk is directed to publish appropriate notice of the same.

WHEREAS, breweries and distilleries are allowed uses within the town’s Light Industrial zone, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to certain NYS licenses issued by the State Liquor Authority, categories of breweries and distilleries are allowed to provide tasting rooms and/or taprooms consistent with and accessory to their existing licenses, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to schedule a public hearing on a proposal to more clearly define the brewery and distillery uses allowed within the Light Industrial district and to provide for the accessory uses consistent with state licensing requirements, as attached; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a public hearing is hereby scheduled for April 1, 2019, at 7:05 P.M. in the Wood Memorial Room, One Town Hall Plaza, Clifton Park, NY, on a proposal to add definitions for distilleries, breweries, taprooms and tasting rooms, as attached, and to streamline the definition of accessory uses throughout the zoning code; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is directed to publish notice of the proposal, attached.

Resolution No. 83 of 2019, a resolution approving an agreement for payment in lieu of taxes with Solitude Solar LLC., dba U.S. Light Energy, 830 Loudon Road, Latham, NY.

Introduced by Councilwoman Standaert, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Walowit.

WHEREAS, Section 487 (9) of the New York State Real Property Tax law authorizes municipalities to enter into Payment in Lieu of Tax Agreements (PILOT) with solar energy developers within each taxing jurisdiction, under certain circumstances, and

WHEREAS, Solitude Solar, dba U.S. Light Energy, 830 Loudon Road, Latham, NY, has Subdivision and Site Plan approval, and has been issued a Special Use Permit for the construction of a 4.75 MW (AC) solar energy project at 164 Sugar Hill Road, Rexford, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board wishes to enter into a PILOT agreement with Solitude Solar LLC., dba U.S. Light Energy, for a solar project and related improvements at 164 Sugar Hill Road pursuant to NYS Real Property Tax Law, Section 487(9); now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is authorized to execute the attached PILOT agreement with Solitude Solar for \$5,100 per MW of capacity (AC), with annual escalations, per Exhibit B to the attached agreement.

Supervisor Barrett explained the solar farm on the capped landfill, that the town constructed, generates 1 MW showing the difference in size from the proposed 164 Sugar Hill Road site which is 4.75 MW. The first year of payment will be 2020. Funds to be directed to specific projects to be determined such as beautification projects, expenses related to the new Town Center Park. Cell tower revenue on the Clifton Common has been used for upgrades needed on the Common.

Councilman Whalen explained this PILOT for solar farms are tax exempt so it is different from other PILOT's used for Economic Development. This is an opportunity for municipalities to offset the lack of tax revenue and use the revenue for public works projects.

Resolution No. 86 of 2019, a resolution adopting Local Law No. 3 of 2019, to amend and rename the Verbeck Frank Planned Development District, by amending Local Law No. 2 of 1967, as amended by Local Law No. 10 of 1996 of the Town Code, entitled “Local Law Relating to Zoning for the Town of Clifton Park”.

Introduced by Councilwoman Standaert, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilman Whalen.

WHEREAS, an application has been presented to the Town Board for an amendment to the existing Verbeck Frank Planned Development District by adding capacity to the existing square footage requirements for the primary structure, and by adding parking capacity to allow for an expansion of the facility to meet patient needs and demand for services, and

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2019, the Planning Board provided an advisory opinion to the Town Board, supporting the application and recommending approval of legislation to provide for the expansion, and approve the application for the zoning change, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board conducted a public hearing on the proposed legislation on March 11, 2019 to receive comment for and against the proposal, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board accepts the recommendation of the Planning Board pursuant to Chapter 208-74 of the Town Code, and finds that the proposed amendment is consistent with the Town’s Comprehensive planning documents, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Department has reviewed the application and recommends classifying the proposed legislation as an unlisted action under SEQRA and issuing a negative declaration under 6 NYCRR 617.2, and 617.7; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board determines that the proposal is consistent with the goals of the town’s Comprehensive Plan and with the objectives of Chapter 208-71 A of the Town Code, and be it further,

RESOLVED, that the Town Board classifies the legislation as an unlisted action and issues a negative declaration pursuant to SEQRA regulations, and be it further,

RESOLVED, that Local Law No. 3 of 2019, a local law amending Local Law No. 2 of 1967, as amended by Local Law No. 10 of 1996 of the Town Code, expanding the authorized capacity of the Peregrine Memory care facility on Emma Lane from 30,000 square feet to 40,000 square feet, adding parking capacity from 30 cars to 40 cars, adjusting the setback requirements for the building as measured from Route 146, and renaming the zoning district as the Emma Lane Planned Development District, as attached, is hereby adopted; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk file said notice with the New York State Department of State as required by law.

Supervisor Barrett noted lighting questions at the public hearing were answered satisfactory by the applicant. He explained the Planning Board will continue to look at the lighting concerns closely. He stated at the public hearing the applicant explained the on-going need for memory care is continuing to grow hence the need to expand the facility. He explained a 100’ buffer will not be disturbed.

Councilman Whalen explained a Certificate of Need will need to be obtained from the NYS Department of Health. He stated the proposal is consistent with the current use.
