Resolution No. 43 of 2021, a resolution awarding the contract for Transfer Station Solid Waste Disposal.

WHEREAS, the town published bid documents for the renewal of the Solid Waste Disposal Contract for the Transfer Station on January 15, 2021, and

WHEREAS, bids were opened on February 3, 2021, and

WHEREAS, Twin Bridges Waste & Recycling submitted the lowest responsive proposal, which includes a unit price of \$72.50 per ton; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the bid of Twin Bridges for residential waste hauling at the Town of Clifton Park Transfer Station is accepted.

Resolution No. 44 of 2021, a resolution extending the hours of the Convenience Transfer Station for the annual Spring Clean-Up/Green-Up and Fall Clean-Up Weeks.

Introduced by Councilwoman Walowit, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Flood.

WHEREAS, a request has been made by Daniel Clemens, Director of Buildings, Parks, and Recreation, for authorization to extend the hours of the Convenience Transfer Station for the annual Spring Clean-Up/Green-Up Week to include Sundays, April 25th and May 2nd, 2021, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Clemens, has also requested that the Transfer Station be open on Sundays, October 24th and 31st, and November 7th, and 14th between the hours of 10 am and 4 pm, for fall cleanup of leaves and brush only; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Daniel Clemens, Director of Buildings, Parks and Recreation is hereby authorized to extend the hours of the Convenience Transfer Station for the annual Spring Clean-Up/Green-Up Week and the annual Fall Clean-Up Week to include Sundays as noted above, with the extended hours to be as set forth in the attached Schedule A; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Sunday hours will be for the collection of leaves and brush only while all other items will be taken during the regular hours from Tuesday through Saturday.

Resolution No. 45 of 2021, a resolution adjusting the Bulk Item Fee Schedule for the Transfer Station.

Introduced by Councilwoman Flood, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Standaert.

WHEREAS, by Local Law No. 2 of 2020, Section 97-3(E) of the Town Code, authorizes the Town Board to make adjustments to the published and posted fee schedule for the disposal of individual bulk items by resolution, and

WHEREAS, Daniel Clemens, Director of Buildings, Parks, and Recreation, has proposed adjustments to the Bulk Item Fee Schedule, attached; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Bulk Item Fee Schedule is amended, as attached, and that the Transfer Station and Town Clerk are authorized to publish the attached schedule for bulk items.

Resolution No. 46 of 2021, a resolution extending intermunicipal agreements between the City of Mechanicville and the Town of Clifton Park, and the Town of Halfmoon and the Town of Clifton Park for the provision of Animal Control Services.

Introduced by Councilwoman Walowit, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Flood.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 119-0 of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, the parties are authorized to enter into binding agreements for the cooperative performance of various municipal projects, contracts and functions, and

WHEREAS, the local governments recognize the benefit to each of the involved municipalities that arise from the cooperative provision of services to their residents, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 15 of 2014, authorized an agreement between the Town of Halfmoon and the Town of Clifton Park, for shared services in the area of animal control, and

WHEREAS, Clifton Park and Mechanicville also entered into such an agreement in 2020, whereby Clifton Park will provide on call and sick/vacation coverage for the prospective Animal Control Departments, and

WHEREAS, Clifton Park has the personnel and equipment to provide on call and sick/vacation coverage for the Halfmoon and Mechanicville Animal Control Departments; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board approves the adoption of an intermunicipal agreement between the City of Mechanicville and the Town of Clifton Park for the provision of Animal Control Services, per the attached agreement, through December 31, 2021; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board approves the adoption of an intermunicipal agreement between the Town of Halfmoon and the Town of Clifton Park for the provision of Animal Control Services, per the attached agreement, through December 31, 2021.

Resolution No. 47 of 2021, a resolution authorizing a change order to add reinforced decking to the existing contract for a portion of the roof replacement project at Town Hall.

Introduced by Councilwoman Standaert, who moved its adoption, seconded by Councilwoman Flood.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 139 of 2020, the Town Board authorized roof replacement projects at Town Hall and the Clifton Park Adult Community Center, and

WHEREAS, MidState Industries Ltd. has submitted a change order for the project in the amount of \$10,705.14, and

WHEREAS, Barton & Loguidice recommended that the Town authorize the change order after the need for additional reinforcement for the roof structures and weatherproof backer boards became apparent after the old roofing was removed; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a change order adding \$10,705.14 to the contract price for the roof replacement project at Town Hall is approved, and Daniel Clemens, Director of Buildings, Parks, and Recreation is authorized to accept the attached proposal from Midstate Industries, at a cost not to exceed \$10,705.14, the funds to come from A-1620-200 (General Fund – Town Hall Operations – Equipment).
